Commemoration of World Wildlife Day 2025

LUMO Conservancy Youth Forum & Wushumbu Youth Forum

Theme: Wildlife Conservation Finance – Investing in People and Planet

Date: 1st March 2025

Location: LUMO Community Wildlife Conservancy & Maktau, Taita Taveta County

Background

World Wildlife Day (WWD) is an international event celebrated annually on March 3rd to raise awareness about the importance of wildlife conservation and biodiversity. The 2025 theme, "Wildlife Conservation Finance – Investing in People and Planet," emphasizes the necessity for sustainable financial investments that benefit both ecosystems and communities.

In Kenya, youth participation in conservation has been a persistent challenge. The SAGE Assessment 2021 revealed that many young people in LUMO and surrounding areas lacked awareness of their rights and roles in conservation. In response, LUMO Conservancy, with support from the BIOPAMA project, established the LUMO Conservancy Youth Forum, comprising 40 young conservation champions from the community.

To further advance their role in conservation, the youth forum, in partnership with the Wushumbu Youth Forum, is commemorating World Wildlife Day 2025 through a community clean-up and awareness walk. This initiative aims to enhance environmental well-being and strengthen community engagement.

Objectives

- 1. Enhance Youth Involvement in Conservation: Empower young people to take active roles in environmental stewardship through participatory activities.
- 2. **Promote Environmental Sustainability:** Encourage practices that lead to cleaner and healthier ecosystems for both wildlife and the community.
- 3. **Strengthen Community Engagement:** Foster a sense of collective responsibility and unity in conservation efforts among community members.

Planned Activity

Community Clean-Up and Awareness Walk (1st March 2025):

- Route: From Maktau Town to LUMO Conservancy Headquarters
- Activity: Participants will clean the highway stretch between Maktau and LUMO HQs, removing litter and promoting environmental consciousness.

Expected Outcomes

- Increased Youth Participation: More young individuals actively engaged in conservation activities.
- Enhanced Environmental Awareness: Greater understanding among community members about the importance of maintaining clean and sustainable environments.
